Vietnam and the Netherlands

Transforming to green growth together

Since the mid-eighties, Vietnam has made tremendous strides to become one of Asia's high-growth emerging markets. Although half a world apart, Vietnam and the Netherlands have much in common: They are both open and entrepreneurial trading nations with long coastlines, large agricultural sectors and fertile deltas. At the same time, the two long-lasted and close trading partners share common interests in dealing with water and climate challenges. Vietnam and the Netherlands have worked together for many years on climate adaptation and mitigation in the Mekong Delta, exchanging knowledge, lesson-learnt and best practices. The two countries also strategically work on coastal management, water management, marine sand extraction and increased sustainability in Vietnam's food production.

The Netherlands as Vietnam's sustainable partner

Over 50 years, Vietnam and the Netherlands have become close economic and knowledge partners. The two countries cooperate in various areas, including climate adaptation and water, sustainable agriculture and food

production, renewable energy, logistics and high tech. But these are not the only reasons the Netherlands is Vietnam's largest EU investor and export destination. The Dutch have built a reputation for offering quality products and services in areas in which Vietnam is interested. Vietnam is a promising market for the Netherlands, partly because of its strategic location in the world's fastest-growing regional economy. Its working-age population is young and has a strong work ethic. In its partnership with Vietnam, the Netherlands aims to combine sustainable development, trade, and investment. In recent years, the close and successful economic cooperation between Vietnam and the Netherlands has resulted in several high-level visits and trade missions in both directions.

Agrifood and Horticulture

In recent years, Vietnam's agriculture sector has witnessed substantial growth and remains an essential part of Vietnam's economic development. The country has become one of Asia's fastest-growing emerging economies. Agriculture accounts for almost 20% of the GDP in Vietnam, and it's projected to grow due to rising government support, investments

overseas, and increasing demands. But - like in the Netherlands - the country also faces several challenges. For instance, salinisation is an increasing problem. Also recognisable between the countries is that both countries are facing a significant labour shortage. They are trying to solve that by mechanising more and looking for other solutions, such as educational and training programs that aim to empower people to change their futures through global development. Only in this way will a sustainable food-producing region in the Mekong Delta be achieved, and the country as a whole will be based on an integrated food system approach with attention to food, nature, and people.

Water

Like the Netherlands, Vietnam is a delta country located by the sea. This makes the country vulnerable to rising sea levels. Vietnam is confronted by many water challenges that risk jeopardising the economy and the environment. Rapid economic development and urbanisation, combined with climate change, are placing tremendous pressure on the country's water resources. Only 12.5% of urban and 71% of industrial wastewater is treated before discharge, and farmers in coastal regions and river basins need more fresh water. Rising demand for water from the urban, industrial, and hydropower sectors is competing with the agriculture sector, which currently uses 80% of water in the country. Increasing water security and water safety is critical to sustainable economic development. Delta and water technology, nature-based solutions, and urban flood management are all areas in which the Netherlands is ready to work with Vietnam on a water-secure future.

Logistics

To fulfil its commitment to net-zero emissions by 2050, Vietnam focuses on developing science and technology application-based multimodal transportation and logistics services. The sector prioritises intensifying "greening" efforts across domains, including green logistics in agriculture, the port and aviation. Vietnam is a central regional trading hub in Asia due to its geographical position as a gateway to South China and ASEAN



markets, being the 2nd largest in ASEAN and ranks 5th worldwide for shipbuilding. The government has declared the maritime sector one of its priorities and is investing in increasing its output capacity as well as the technology level of the industry. By sharing the Netherlands' expertise and technology in the logistics chain with Vietnam, both countries can continue to find intelligent and integrated solutions that result in more sustainable trade, investment, and cooperation in projects and knowledge exchange in efficient transport systems.

Towards a long-term partnership

Increasing global pressures on global resources and climate change underline the need for international collaboration. Vietnam and the Netherlands are both countries that seek practical applications and ideas for global challenges. Together with their commitment to becoming comprehensive partners, positioning companies and knowledge institutions from the Netherlands and matching their knowledge and expertise to Vietnamese demand, they can accelerate the global transition towards a sustainable future.
